### Set Subject Period ID for a Session (Version 2005)

Pathway: **Scholastic - System Functions - Curriculum Control Files - Subject Period ID**

To assist users who are currently working on their 2008 timetables, PCSchool has added a new feature in Curriculum that will allow you to set a Session Subject Period ID.

This allows users to set the default Subject Period to Term 1, 2008 so that it will automatically appear when entering subject related views.

This default will only affect the users computer and only until the user logs out of PCSchool or changes to another module.

The ability to set this default for one machine for the length of a session has been introduced so that curriculum staff do not need to constantly


change the Period ID each time they go into a subject/timetable view.

Alternatively it will also avoid the need to change the Subject Period ID for the entire system causing others to have to change the Period ID when they need to print Term 4, 2007 timetables or class lists.

Those schools currently on Version 2005 of PCSchool can obtain this function by downloading the following file:

**Ensure everyone is out of PCSchool**, open the downloaded folder and copy the Curric.exe and Versions.pcs file therein into their PCSchool\Programs folder on the server.
